

Have your say about future improvements to Aireville Park in Skipton (BD23 1UD)

Aireville Park has previously had some new facilities including the play area, skate park and pump track (thanks to the former Friends of Aireville Park) but the multi-use games area is currently in a very poor condition. North Yorkshire Council is looking to develop a new plan to further improve this much-loved local green space.

This public consultation will gather opinions from residents and park users helping the council to understand what improvements are needed. The consultation report will be used to inform the final proposals.

Funding of £100,000 from Commuted Sums has been allocated for future improvements to the park. This is money paid to North Yorkshire Council by property developers when providing residential properties within the council area.
